Related Project Experience

In-patient Hospice, IU Health Bloomington Hospital; Bloomington, IN — 11,000 sq. ft. An 8-bed facility for terminally-ill patients designed for future expansion for 4 additional beds. Client required a home-like feel, creating a more comfortable setting for patients and families dealing with the end-of-life process. In addition, the building and site incorporated environmental friendly strategies such as rain gardens, geothermal technology, recyclable materials and diversion of waste from landfills. This project anticipates LEED certification.

Medical Oncology Relocation, Community Hospital East; Indianapolis, IN — 7,100 sq. ft. space designed for relocation and enlargement of pre-existing oncology suite. This new, 8 exam, 16 treatment station facility encompasses a tranquil setting for patients spending large amounts of time for infusion services. Desperately needed office and staff support space was also created.

Conference Center; Dayton, OH (not built) — Schematic design of conference and auditorium space, meeting hall, classrooms and offices adjacent to a pre-existing hotel. Beautiful, elliptically-shaped, stone-clad auditorium space surrounded by a curving multi-story, glass break-out space provides guests with a relaxing environment for learning.
